



## 2016 CDYST Invitational Tournament Wrap-up

Justin Carl of Albany defeated Hunter Kempton of Buzzard's Bay, MA 211 – 193 to win the Capital District Youth Scholarship Tour Invitational held at Hi-Way Recreation on Saturday, April 23th.

The modified stepladder finals began with sixth-seeded Alex Alesio of Schenectady (199) defeating fifth-seeded Christopher Kokes of Mooers (176) and fourth-seeded Christopher Radliff of Schenectady (162). By finishing the match 14 pins ahead of Radliff, Kokes' seven-game total pinfall enabled him to finish fifth; ahead of Radliff, who was sixth. As the respective fourth and fifth place finishers in the Boys Division, Kokes and Radliff earned \$125 and \$100 scholarships. The second-seeded Kempton (211) then defeat Alesio (178) and third-seeded Mariah Williams of Bloomington (140) to set up the title match. Alesio finished in third place overall and earned a \$200 scholarship for being third in the Boys Division. Williams finished fourth overall and earned a \$350 scholarship as the Girls Division champion.

Carl began the championship match with three consecutive strikes to take a 32-pin lead. Kempton rolled strikes in the sixth and seventh frames to close to within nine pins. He would finish with a one-pin lead that forced Carl to strike on his first ball in the tenth; which he did to earn his third title of the season and break a tie for second all-time with his seventh career victory. He also earned a \$500 scholarship for finishing first in the Boys Division. Kempton won a \$300 scholarship for his runner-up finish.

Boys and girls competed in separate divisions and rolled two three-game blocks on different USBC Sport-Certified lane conditions that were not furnished to the bowlers in advance. The top six bowlers, regardless of division, advanced to the finals.

Starting on the 39-foot 2013 USBC Open Doubles/Singles pattern, Patrick Hoey of Latham and Britaney Myers of Mechanicville were tied for the overall lead following Game 1. Kokes then took the lead following Game 2 before Carl rolled a 264 in Game 3 to become the leader at the halfway point. In the Girls Division, Williams moved ahead after Game 2. Jenna Lemke of Delmar then became the third different leader heading into the second round.

Bowling on a 46-foot pattern with a 1.8:1 oil ratio, Kokes moved back into the lead after Game 4. However, Radliff used a second consecutive game over 230 to move ahead following Game 5. In Game 6, Carl rolled 223 and Kempton had 237 to earn the top two seeds respectively. Williams assumed the lead by five pins in the Girls Division following Game 4 and closed with games of 213 and 202 to pull away in her division and ultimately earn the third seed overall by two pins over Radliff, the high scorer in block two.

In this special event open to CDYST members only, 39 bowlers (26 boys and 13 girls) competed. Additional scholarship winners in the Boys division were Brandon Wolf of Schenectady (\$80) in sixth place (7th overall); Andrew Marotta of Ballston Spa (\$70) in seventh (eighth overall); Zack Terry of Schenectady (\$60) in eighth (tenth overall); and Garrett Bartlett of Troy (\$50) in ninth (11th overall). In the Girls division, Lemke (\$200) finished second (ninth overall); Myers (\$125) was third; Morgan Ruggeri of Johnstown (\$75) finished fourth (19th overall); and Katie Lynch of Troy (\$50) finished fifth (24th overall). Our talented youth bowlers earned \$2,410 in scholarships, bringing the season total to \$19,725. Patrick Hoey of Latham and Nick Fuller of South Glens Falls earned entries into the 2016 USBC Junior Gold Championships to be held in Indianapolis.

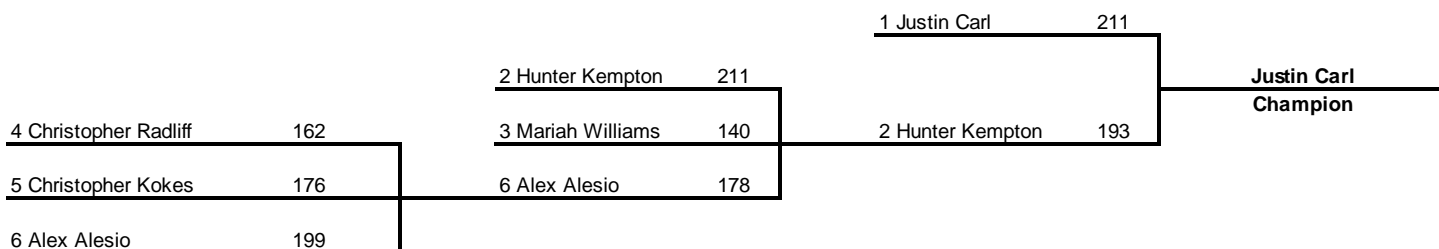
